Young Carers Assembly

On Tuesday last week representatives from Kent Young Carers presented in assembly and here are some commentaries from pupils in Bramley and Discovery .

'We were very lucky because Young carers came to talk about what they do. Young carers are children below the age of 18 who look after parents/guardians and brothers/ sisters with disabilities like autism. They help all sorts of ways like shopping and running baths. There's a club for young carers where they can go on trips and fun enjoying parties. This provides them time away from the extra work they are doing.' Kit and Joshua.

In assembly on Monday 18th, a pair of people from Kent Young Carers came in and told us about the things young carers do and the lengths they go to for their patient. They have set up a club for young carers. They go on lots of fun

trips everywhere and even host a Christmas party.

They also told us that the people being cared for could sometimes have ADHD or autism. Not all carers recognise that they are caring for someone so that is another reason they have the clubs to help you recognise if you're a young carer. The other surprising fact was that young carers themselves could have a problem and still care for other people with issues.' Jola
