Hunton Primary School

Since April, I have been leading Hunton Primary as well as here. The new substantive Head takes over full responsibility for Hunton school in the new year. It is hard to believe the situations we have all faced since March but taking over an unfamiliar school as a pandemic started was certainly not a situation I thought I would ever face!

Unsurprisingly, it has been challenging but also most rewarding. It is quite incredible how our 4 church schools operating under the same Local Authority and Diocese are so distinctive in their offer to their pupils. This is something to be cherished.

My task has been made much easier by every section of St. Margaret's Collier Street school community. As parents, your supportive comments have been really appreciated. The staff have been terrific. I would especially like to thank Mrs Bannon for originally agreeing to undertake her role on a Thursday and Friday just until July and then with schools thrown into turmoil and no Headteacher appointments being able to be made, extending this arrangement until December.

Going forward, a new Headteacher needs support and mentoring and having undertaken this previously, I have agreed to do this at Hunton for 1 day per week for terms 3 and 4. However, as you can imagine, this is a very different role to actually being responsible for every aspect of the school 7 days a week!
