An Anti-Bullying Policy for Children

A bully is a person who purposely tries to hurt others by:

- Hurting them by kicking, hitting, pushing, tripping, etc.
- Making them feel uncomfortable.
- Name-calling, inappropriate language, or body language.
- Spreading nasty rumours.
- Being mean.

If you think you are being bullied:

DO: -

- Ask them to stop in a firm way. Use eye contact and tell them to leave you alone.
- Walk away and find friends to play with.
- Talk to an adult in school. They will always be there for you - just **tell** them (You may like to go with a friend).

DON'T: -

- Do what they say.
- Get angry.
- Show you are upset.
- Hit them.
- Hide it.
- Think it's your fault.

What should I do if I see someone else is being bullied?

- Don't walk away and ignore the bullying.
- Let the bully know what is happening.
- Tell the bully to stop if it is safe to do so.
- Don't stay silent – tell someone

The Headteacher, the Governors and the staff will work together to: -

- Make our school a place where everyone is listened to and can feel safe and happy.
- We will help everyone to get on with each other and we believe that everyone has the right to be who they are.
